# Elizabeth Henske

Dr. Elizabeth (Lisa) Henske is the founding Director of the Center for LAM Research and Clinical Care at the Brigham and Women's Hospital in Boston MA. The Henske research laboratory is focused on the cellular and molecular mechanisms through which mutations in the Tuberous Sclerosis Complex (TSC) genes lead to TSC and LAM.

Lisa's discoveries have revolutionised our understanding of both TSC and LAM and her current work on the next phase of TSC research will inspire attendees with hope for a future cure for TSC and LAM.

## **Elizabeth Thiele**

An experienced neurologist and epileptologist, Dr Elizabeth Thiele is the Director of the Paediatric Epilepsy Program and the Director of the Herscot Centre for Children and Adults with Tuberous Sclerosis Complex at Massachusetts General Hospital. Elizabeth's extensive research on epilepsy and TSC allows her to offer fresh perspectives on the care of patients of all ages with Tuberous Sclerosis.
